

Bloodborne Pathogens Protocol

Employees exposed to bloodborne pathogens must immediately notify their supervisor. Treatment should be obtained from Medical Access, the MCSIP Designated Treatment Provider. After hours, Dr. Takhar of Medical Access is available to provide treatment and consultation services by telephone.

The supervisor should provide the Medical Access location and number to the employee. If possible, the supervisor should call to notify Medical Access that the employee will be arriving for an evaluation.

The employee should contact Dr. Takhar at (301)483-1070. Following the discussion with Dr. Takhar, if care is recommended treatment should be received from the nearest emergency facility. Dr. Takhar will contact the selected facility to discuss treatment options. During the next business day, the employee should contact Medical Access to discuss a convenient time to see Dr. Takhar.

Treatment after Normal Business Hours

If treatment is required after hours, the emergency room physician will administer the necessary medication. However, if this is not possible and there are immediate pharmaceutical needs, the supervisor should visit the Montgomery County Self-Insurance Program website www.mcsip.org

Within the website there is a link for CorVel CorCareRX, MCI's team partner managing Workers' Compensation Drug Plans.



To assist the employee, the supervisor should print a First Fill Card (temporary pharmacy card). Providing a First Fill Card eliminates the need for out-of-pocket expenses thus making the process convenient for the employee.

CorCareRX (CCR) FirstFill Pharmacy Instructions

The CorCareRX FirstFill Pharmacy Instructions and Card should be provided to injured worker following an accident. There are two ways to access the instructions and card:

Option 1

The supervisor can download the [CorCareRX FirstFill Pharmacy Instructions](#) form. The form should be completed prior to giving to the employee. The injured employee can take the completed form to a network pharmacist.

Option 2

As the supervisor reports the Loss via CareMC online, an Initial Treatment Guide – Physician Pharmacy can be generated. The Initial Treatment Guide includes physician and pharmacist information. See the [Sample CorCareRX FirstFill Initial Treatment Guide](#).

Source Testing:

Medical Access will provide source testing. The employee requesting source to be tested must provide CorVel and Medical Access with the necessary contact information for the source. If testing is performed by an area hospital, the source will need to give permission for the results to be released to Medical Access.
